SHIBORI AND HOW ONE ARTIST USES IT

This workshop, presented by Anne Willis, will demonstrate the fascinating craft of resist dyeing fabric using Shibori techniques. A slide show will accompany the demonstration. Shibori refers to a number of fabric dyeing techniques, involving binding (tie-dye), folding, stitching (tritik), and pole wrapping (arashi). This program will show how they can be used separately or in combination, or even combined with batik using antique Indonesian tjaps (copper stamps).
